

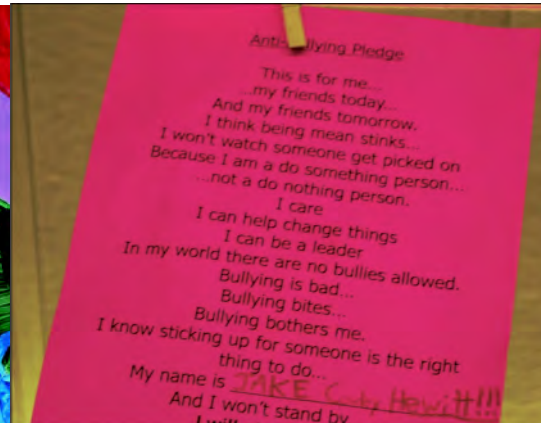

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

We began this year by participating in another strategic visioning process. Although, in the end, this process produced what we consider a good "operations" plan as opposed to a real strategic visioning exercise, we did set the groundwork for future discussion by approving a new vision statement: Strengthening Community through Empowering Children, Youth & Families.

An ad hoc Compensation Committee solicited feedback from staff, looked at the fiscal realities of our current budgets and made several recommendations to the Board who, in turn, unanimously approved two new policies to recognize and support the outstanding contributions of our staff. These policies allow for each staff to have one paid Family Day (of their choosing) off each year as well as entitling all full time employees to a Healthy Living Allowance of up to \$100 to be applied against the "healthy living" activity/resource of their choice.

With renewed emphasis on strategic planning, the Board reviewed, revised and set in motion new Terms of Reference and expectations for a number of committees including Human Resources, Program and Facilities.

Early in the year, the Facilities Committee, headed by Kris Charmley, focused on plans for a new washhouse for the camp. The Foundation readily approved their recommendations which strategically enabled us to have the new building ready for summer camp.

Similarly, a new emphasis on the Nominating Committee functions, under the able leadership of Mike Sidhu, resulted in the recruitment of seven dynamic new Board members. We welcomed Violaine Mitchell, Terry Spence, Shannon Russell, Cheryl d'Estrubé, Jamie Pearce, Elena Kanigan and Hilary Wheeler to our numbers. Their enthusiasm and energy has already invigorated our revised committee structure.

With so many new members it was timely to redesign our Board orientation which mirrors the new staff package except it is more succinct and focuses on governance functions. Similarly, we are planning to hold a full Board retreat to review and streamline our governance approaches once the new Executive Director is in place in the new fiscal year.

This naturally segues into the creation of the Executive Director Succession Planning Committee which was struck in May to recruit and hire a replacement for Ralph Hembruff, who had announced his intentions to retire by summer 2010. Headed by former Board member (and current National Board member) Ilka Bene, this committee has developed a number of important tools including: a resource binder on succession planning, a comprehensive transition plan, a document entitled "Key & Emerging Issues", a revitalized job description for the Executive Director as well as a critical skill sets check list. We have also retained the services of the Executive Network to help us in our recruitment efforts. The new Executive Director will be introduced at the AGM.

Other projects various Board members have been involved with include:

- Helping our Provincial Association move forward with the National/Regional realignment initiative
- Board Voice – Mike Sidhu attended the inaugural meeting of the fledging group and then participated in the first Board Voice conference in Vancouver where a new society was created and of which we became a founding member. Basically, the purpose of Board Voice is to provide a vehicle for boards of community social service agencies around the province to share information and collectively advocate for and speak knowledgeably about the challenges faced by our sector without the perception of "vested interest" often associated with presentations by staff.

We have also used the information garnered in the strategic visioning process to develop an annual plan with expectations of on-going committee updates and semi-annual report cards on general progress. Realizing we have more strategic visioning to do upon the arrival of our new Executive Director, the staff recruited a special volunteer to generate a community research report on current and projected demographic trends in our community.

2010 is our 50th Anniversary as an agency and we have struck another ad hoc Committee to provide oversight and support to some special events this year (stay tuned!)

As I end my term as President, I should like to thank all staff and fellow Board members for the tremendous support they have provided me over the past several years. It has been a

privilege and honour to serve as president for an organization so dedicated to making our communities a better place in which to live. I welcome Kris Charmley as the incoming new president and wish him well during his tenure.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Celebrations were the norm right from the start of our new fiscal year as one of our youth leaders – Jonathan Russell – received the Amazing Kid award from Save-On-Foods and /A\ Vancouver Island Channel. And we just kept building on that auspicious start.

For example, many staff participated in two full days of training with the SITI initiative which included presentations on the Youth Justice Jeopardy Board designed and facilitated by our own KickStart staff. We provided proactive leadership in the anti-bullying Pink Shirt Day culminating in a community dinner at the Central Saanich Club. Eighteen staff took the Safe Harbour Training to ensure all our facilities meet these standards. Eight attendees participated in the Boys & Girls Clubs bi-regional workshops in Kelowna with keynotes from Hugh Culver and John McKnight. We hosted part of the Canadian Adventure Therapy Symposium at camp as well as an internal workshop on intentional programming. Our staff entered an "Assets in Motion" team in the Times Columnist 10K run while other folks participated in staff-hosted meditation classes at our downtown facility. And another of our youth leaders – Evan Willow – received the Friendship Award at the United Way Youth Now Awards celebration.

A staff committee developed and continues to present a comprehensive agency orientation to all new employees and volunteers. We participated in the Family Roots Adventure Therapy program in partnership with Sooke Family Resource Centre and the Power To Be Adventure Therapy Society as well as launching a Parenting Without Power Struggles program. There were also other numerous program and agency BBQ's, appreciation celebrations, special outings and a variety of workshops both attended and presented by our

talented staff.

Not only did we take part in a new strategic planning process, as covered in the President's Report, we commissioned a comprehensive operational assessment and business plan for the entire camp venture.

Similarly, we undertook a feasibility study with Big Brothers Big Sisters of Victoria (BBBS) to determine possible efficiencies and potential co-sharing of facilities. While we did not move to a co-habitation model, several positive "unintended consequences" came from that review:

- We decided to move our services from the rental Pembroke Street location to our downtown facility at 1240 Yates thereby bringing many of our diverse programs (and staff) into more direct contact with each other.
- This also led to retaining Number 10 Architectural Group to produce preliminary drawings for a redesign of this central location into a more efficient floor plan.
- Similarly, the discussions facilitated by the study led to a contract with BBBS to provide accounting services – an good example of efficient, "win/win" management.

We went through the preparation and successful completion of another CARF accreditation (3 year certificate) which we celebrated as an agency with a "Transitions" workshop at camp masterfully facilitated by Gareth Woods.

Then there is the on-going saga of our contracts with the Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD). The year started positively with another 1.6% cost pressure increase applied to these contracts. We then spent the remainder of the year engaged in an intensive South Island Contract Review process wherein all the programs and

services contracted through MCFD on the lower island are under review. Done in an atmosphere of cost pressures and projected budget reductions, we are collectively trying to determine where the areas of greatest need are and how best various types of services can be delivered. It promises to be both an exciting and extremely anxiety-producing time during the next fiscal cycle as the information from these meetings will be translated into some substantive changes in how the contracted community social services sector does business on the lower island.

And these are only the events that I can remember! Thankfully, we have both the President's Report and the Foundation report to cover many of the other diverse projects we were also involved with.

As this will be my last Annual General Meeting and thus report, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the

literally thousands of staff and volunteers who have taught me so much over the last three decades. It has been a truly amazing and gratifying journey. Having worked with such generous, passionate and dedicated folks has given me infinite confidence that, despite what I might see and hear on the news, collectively we are surrounded with boundless hope and optimism which, in turn, gives me wonderful assurances for the future generations of our community.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Annual financial statements present a numerical report on the operations of Boys & Girls Club Services of Greater Victoria for the fiscal year ended January 31, 2010. The statements do not reflect the dedication and hard work staff, Board members and an incredible array of volunteers and donors contribute to the mission and vision of our organization. These contributions are reflected in the lives of the children, youth and families we serve.


Our Annual Report and our speakers at the AGM will report further on the human side of our agency and provide details of the many contributors who are greatly appreciated. Also greatly appreciated is the ongoing contribution from our accounting and administrative staff and a diverse and dedicated Board of Directors.

Our financial statements reflect a second year of losses (\$33,822 in 2010 and \$10,775 in 2009). Our budget in 2011

presents further challenges and has not been finalized pending negotiations related to renewal of provincial government contracts. A third year of losses is anticipated in 2011.

Club Services is also losing an experienced and dedicated servant with the retirement of its long-time Executive Director, Ralph Hembruff. Ralph carried a passion for youth and families, our employees and our volunteers which will be passed on to future generations as his legacy.

On a more positive note, we have, over the past year, gained a significant number of new, enthusiastic Board members and a new Executive Director, Patti Sullivan, who begins



MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Resilience is a quality that our staff seeks to build in the children and youth they serve and one that can be equally desirable in an organization. Our Foundation and indeed Boys & Girls Club Services have this in spades as we continue to weather the vagaries of the economy. Our development office reports an overall decrease in donations or grants of approximately \$293,000 compared to the 2008/09 fiscal year. A significant portion of that is made up of pledges to our Create a Ripple campaign being completed. It was primarily contributions from businesses and individuals that decreased but a large portion of the drop in donations from individuals was a result of one large donation of \$94,000 we received in 2008/09 for our Create a Ripple Campaign.

In 2009, the Vancouver Foundation reported in "Weathering the Storm" that almost every charity has been impacted in one way or another by the economy. More than half of all charities surveyed (53%) experienced a drop in revenue in their current fiscal year, with the average decline being 19%. Of the 27% of charities who did manage to see an increase in their revenue in 2009, many attributed to one-time grants that would not be carried forward into the next fiscal year. This is largely the case with Boys & Girls Clubs as we saw an increase of almost \$32,000 in grants.

"Weathering the Storm" went on to report that many charities dealt with this year's budget challenges by looking for new sources of revenue (62%) or undertaking more fundraising (58%). Again, this is certainly true of our organization, however, this means that more organizations

are searching for what is, essentially, a shrinking pool of funds. It is a testament to the hard work by staff that we continue to find success in this area. I offer my congratulations and thanks to them.

To the many businesses, individuals and organizations who continue to support us generously – a heartfelt thanks. More than ever we need your support to ensure that we continue to deliver quality programs that address the needs of our children, youth and their families.

This is my last term as President of the Foundation Board of Directors but I will be continuing my service to Boys & Girls Clubs as President of the Services Board. I am privileged to be part of a team of dedicated staff and volunteers that are so committed to building and enhancing the quality of life for the youth and families in our community. I look forward to continuing my service in this new capacity and meeting the challenges of the coming years.

In closing, I wish to once again thank our dedicated staff, the management team, volunteers and my fellow Board of Directors for their continued enthusiastic commitment to making a difference in our community.

MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT

I'm a sucker for disaster movies. The acting is invariably over the top, the plot usually leaves much to be desired, and sometimes they are just downright unbelievable but there is something about a disaster flick that draws me in every time. I think it's because everyday people rise to the occasion and heroic leadership emerges from characters that no one expected had it in them. Everyone pulls together and the _____ (you fill in the blank!) is saved.

Perhaps that is why I am so impressed with the people involved in not for profit organizations and in particular why I am always blown away by the Boys & Girls Club cast of characters. Now I am not suggesting that Boys & Girls Clubs are a disaster movie! But there are similarities in that we always seem to be facing huge challenges – from funding cuts and shifting priorities to the increasing severity

in the issues that children, youth and families face to the lack of awareness of just how important the programs are that provide children and youth with the skills, experiences and opportunities they need to grow up healthy and not only able to weather their own adversities but to thrive and take on leadership roles in the community. Every day our staff demonstrate those heroic leadership qualities that save the day or rather, more importantly, literally save the future of the young people they work with. Every day volunteers put their shoulders to the wheel to keep things moving forward. Every day donors and funders come through with the dollars that support those programs. Heroes every one in my book and I have nothing but the utmost respect and admiration for them all – no bad acting here! They all deserve the academy award for caring.

While we have continually faced and overcome challenges one thing remains constant – the need to support children and youth in our community. We were founded in 1960 to get young boys off the street and sometimes the more things change the more they stay the same. Over a decade ago we introduced developmental asset building as defined by the Search Institute as a focus to mobilize the community to care about kids, *all kids*. In 2010 we share our 50th anniversary with the Search Institute and in closing I would like to share with you their five actions strategies for transforming communities and society to create a world where all young people are valued and thrive:



Engage Adults — Engage adults from all walks of life to develop sustained, strength-building relationships with children and adolescents, both within families and in neighbourhoods.

Mobilize Young People— Mobilize young people to use their power as asset builders and change agents.

Activate Sectors — Activate all sectors of the community—such as schools, congregations, youth, businesses, human services, and health-care organizations—to create an asset-building culture and to contribute fully to young people's healthy development.

Invigorate Programs— Invigorate, expand, and enhance programs to become more asset rich and to be available to and accessed by all children and youth.

Influence Civic Decisions — Influence decision makers and opinion leaders to leverage financial, media, and policy resources in support of this positive transformation of communities and society.

Our deepest thanks to those individuals, organizations and businesses who already support us in building assets in young people. To everyone else this is an invitation to join us.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The investment markets were much kinder this year, seeing the Foundation recover most of the losses incurred from the previous period. Donations and fundraising income were down from last year which is tell-tale sign of the lingering economic downturn.

The Foundation distributed a total of \$237,247 to support programs operated by Boys & Girls Club (\$185,417) and BC Paraplegic Association (\$51,830) as their portion of the net proceeds from the Monopoly Madness 2009 event.

The cash balances for the Foundation total \$387,373 and investments total \$886,274. The decline in cash from the previous period (\$363,994) is a result of the completion of capital projects such as the Mel Cooper Cabin, the much needed Wash House and a large log picnic shelter.

The Foundation has reduced the mortgage payable during the year by \$76,000 leaving a remaining balance of \$110,000. The remaining outstanding pledges for the Create A Ripple Campaign total \$120,000 which will go

towards the remainder of the mortgage and interest payments.

To all of our supporters – those who gave so generously to our Annual Appeal and supported our Community Clubs; the Create A Ripple Campaign; those who responded to our newsletter; those who remembered a dear friend or family member by contributing to our Endowment Funds – we offer our sincerest thanks.


